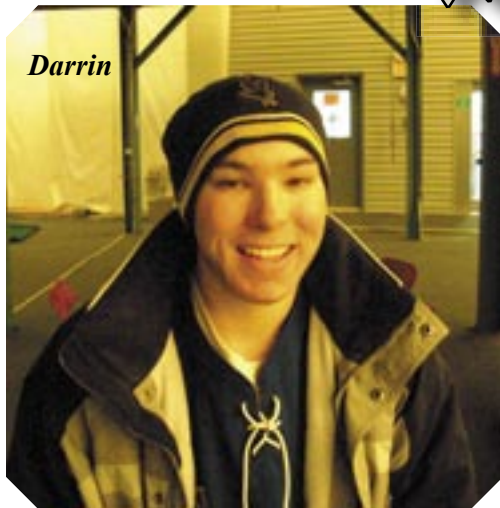

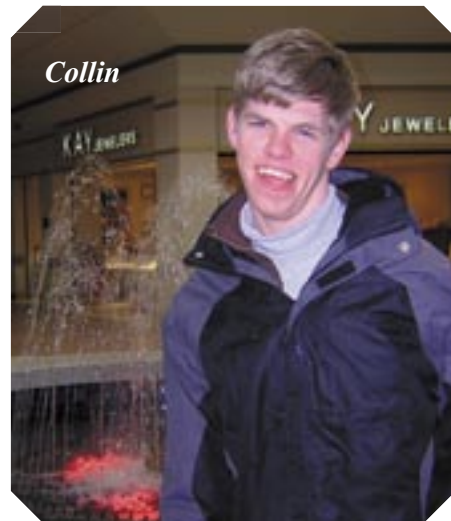
WELCOME!

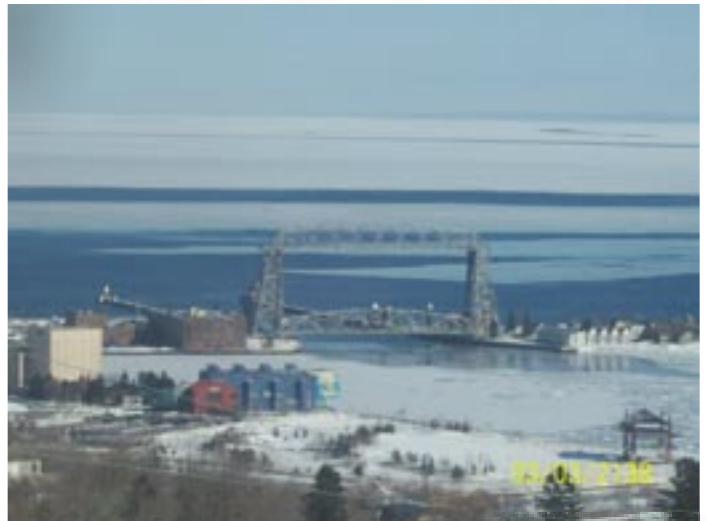
The Lakes Area Provider

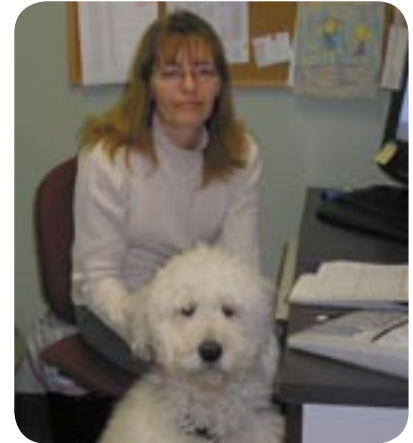
Samn Degerstedt

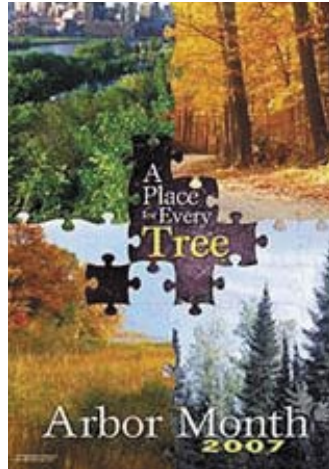


EARTHNOTES

Arbor Day celebrations began in Nebraska in 1872 when Nebraska, along with other Great Plains states, had almost no trees. J. Sterling Morton believed Nebraska needed more trees, so he sponsored a campaign for tree planting which was the beginning of Arbor Day. All 50 states observe Arbor Day on various dates and all plant trees on that day. In 1876, Minnesota became the fourth state to adopt the tradition of celebrating Arbor Day. Since 1978, May has been Arbor Month in Minnesota. The warmer weather in May allows newly planted trees to get off to a good start. Planting a tree helps create a healthy

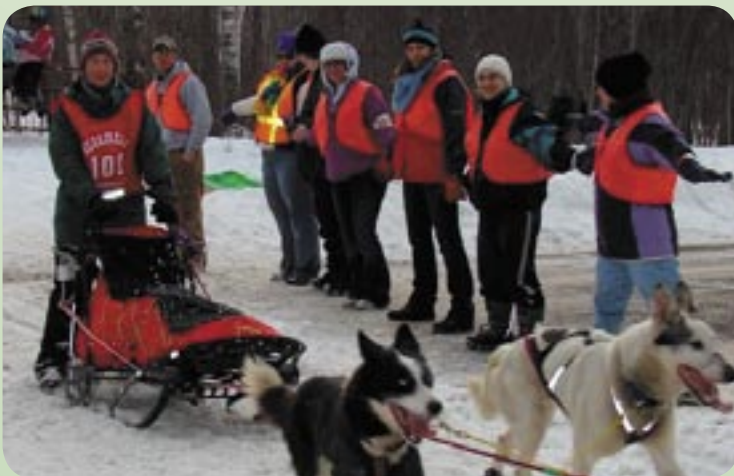

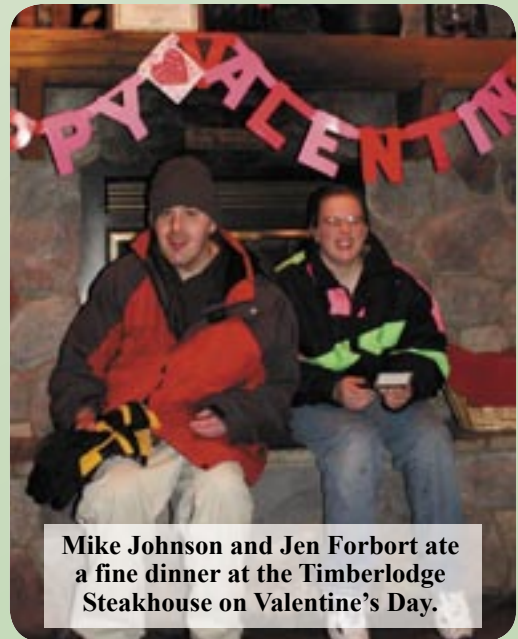

Preventing back injury --

Are you using the proper body mechanics while lifting so you don't injure yourself? Here are a few tips to prevent injury:

- Choose the shortest distance.
- Have a clear path.
- Make sure your center of gravity is directly over your feet to increase stability.



- Lift with your legs, not your back.
- Use smooth, slow motions.
- Pivot, don't twist.
- Keep load close to body.
- Plan ahead.
- Ask for assistance, if needed.
- Keep your feet at least shoulder-width apart.
- Bend your knees and use your leg muscles.
- If lifting a person, tell them what you will do and how they should help. Have them repeat it back to you.

Causes of low back pain include: poor posture, faulty body



mechanics, stressful work and living habits, decreased flexibility and decreased physical fitness. Some ways to protect yourself and prevent injury are: keep good posture, use good body mechanics, stay flexible and physically fit, and decrease stress.

Using proper body mechanics will help you prevent back injuries. Please use these precautions and stay healthy.

CHICKEN PARMESAN

Ingredients:

- Boneless skinless chicken breasts (pound to 1/2 inch thick)
- ¼ c. Parmesan cheese
- 1 c. Crushed croutons (to breadcrumb consistency)
- 1 Egg, beaten
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- Spaghetti sauce
- Shredded mozzarella cheese

Preparation:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix crouton crumbs with parmesan cheese in shallow dish. Dip chicken into beaten egg and roll in crumb mixture to coat.
2. Melt butter in large skillet over medium heat. Add chicken and cook until browned, turning once (about 5 minutes each side). Place chicken in lightly greased 9x13 pan.
3. Spoon sauce over chicken, sprinkle with mozzarella cheese and bake for 20-30 minutes.
4. Serve over your choice of noodles. (Tastes excellent over egg noodles!)

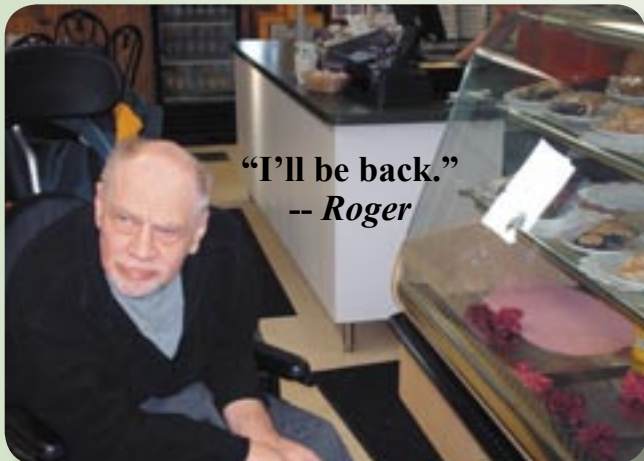

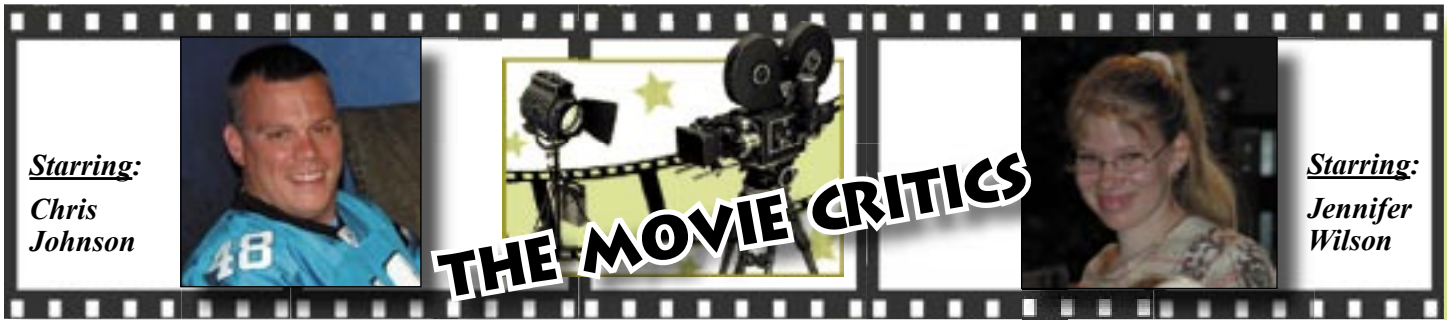

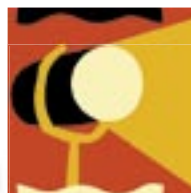
